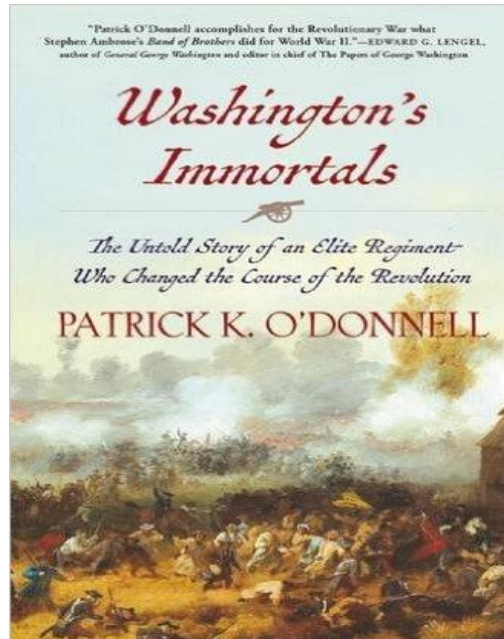

Join us with author Patrick K. O'Donnell, as he discusses *WASHINGTON'S IMMORTALS: The Untold Story of an Elite Regiment Who Changed the Course of the Revolution*. A light reception and book signing will follow his talk.

In August 1776, after the Continental Congress had declared independence from Great Britain, the Revolution was on the verge of a disastrous end when General George Washington's army was outmanned and outmaneuvered at the Battle of Brooklyn. A series of courageous bayonet charges by elements of a single regiment, famously known as the "**Immortal 400**," Washington was able to evacuate his men, and the Continental Army lived to fight another day at in the crucial battles of Trenton, Princeton, Camden, Cowpens, Guilford Courthouse, and Yorktown.

Drawing on extensive unpublished letters, diaries, and pension applications, O'Donnell's *IMMORTALS* is a gripping, boots on the ground history that transports the reader to the bloodiest battles and the darkest days of the Revolutionary War, in the company of men whose extraordinary sacrifices, endurance of unimaginable hardship, and valiant fighting made the difference between victory and defeat.
